So, what do these sheep cost?


Short answer: It depends. Long answer: It really depends.

We price lambs based on:

- Structure
- Wool quality
- Markings
- Genetics
- Rarity (yes, polled and spitti counts here)

Typical full-blood ranges (as of now):

- Rams: \$9,000 to \$20,000
- Ewes: \$12,000 to \$25,000
